

Pentecost – Shavuot

- * Shavuot sha-VU-ot Festival of Weeks, celebrated on the 50th day after Passover, also Pentecost, Greek for "50"
- **One of Three Pilgrimage Festivals**
 - 1. Passover Deliverance of Hebrews from Egypt
 - 2. Shavuot Festival of Weeks, celebrated ONE DAY
 - 3. Sukkot Festival of Booths, recalling 40 years wandering
- **Shavuot celebrated the covenants with Noah and Moses**



Pentecost - Shavuot

- * Encyclopedia Judaica: possible Pharisees made Shavuot commemorate the giving of the Torah before Christ, believing as they did the Torah was given at Sinai on the 50th day after the Exodus, something the Sadducees denied.
- **Yet, Philo and Josephus make** *no reference* **to Shavuot as commemorating the time of the giving of the Torah.**
- **AD 200+ celebrated anniversary Torah given at Sinai**

C. God the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God. He inspired holy men of old to write the Scriptures. Through illumination He enables men to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts of sin, of righteousness and of judgment. He calls men to the Saviour, and effects regeneration. He cultivates Christian character, comforts believers, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. He seals the believer unto the day of final redemption. His presence in the Christian is the assurance of God to bring the believer into the fullness of the stature of Christ. He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service.

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






5-13 Questions asked – Galileans drunk?

⁵And there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven.... ⁶heard them speak in his own language. ⁷And they were all amazed and marveled ... are not all these which speak Galileans? 8And how hear we every man in our own tongue, wherein we were born? 9Parthians, and Medes, and Elamites, and the dwellers in Mesopotamia, and in Judaea, and Cappadocia, in Pontus, and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia, and Pamphylia, in Egypt, and in the parts of Libya about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretes and Arabians, we do hear them speak in our tongues the wonderful works of God. ¹²And they were all amazed, and were in doubt, saying one to another, What meaneth this?







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

14-15 Opportunity Seized - Peter, "Let me explain...."

¹⁴But Peter, standing up with the eleven, lifted up his voice, and said unto them, Ye men of Judaea, and all ye that dwell at Jerusalem, be this known unto you, and hearken to my words: ¹⁵For these are not drunken, as ye suppose, seeing it is *but* the third hour of the day.

16-36 Peter from Joel and David to Jesus is Lord and Christ Peter – First Witness

37-47 "What shall we do" ... were added about 3,000!







Early Church BONUS

Acts 28, Paul & Rome AD 63 - AD 64, Nero burns Rome

Quo Vadis, 1951 epic MGM film adapted from the classic novel Quo Vadis (1896) by Henryk Sienkiewicz. Marcus Vinicius, a Roman patrician, falls for Lygia, a Christian, and he attempts to save her from Nero's increasing insanity.

"Quo Vadis"—"Where are you going?" refers to a Christian tradition of St Peter from the apocryphal Acts of Peter (Vercelli Acts XXXV). As Peter flees Rome, he meets the risen Jesus and asks Jesus "Quo vadis?" Jesus replies, "Romam eo iterum crucifigi"—"I am going to Rome to be crucified again." Peter gains the courage to return to Roman and his ministry, and eventually to be crucified.

Unworthy to be crucified as his Lord was, he asked to be crucified upside-down.

The Church of Domine Quo Vadis in Rome is built where, according to legend, the meeting between Peter and Jesus took place.
