








Major Danial Webster Whittle

- ✓ Also wrote "Showers of blessings"
- ✓ Served with Union Gen. Sherman in Civil War
- Married the day before he left
- ✓ Wounded and lost arm ... then POW







Major Danial Webster Whittle

- ✓ Bored, found a N.T. his mother had placed
- ✓ Confessed Christ at foot of wounded soldier ... who soon after died
- ✓ Settled in Chicago, worked with D.L. Moody

5:12-17 Apostles Heal Many - Shadow Should Fall


- 12 The apostles performed many signs & wonders among the people.


 All the believers used to meet together in Solomon's Colonnade.
- 13 No one else dared join them, even though they were highly regarded by the people.
- 14 Nevertheless, more & more ... believed in the Lord....
- 15 As a result, people brought the sick... laid them on mats so that at least Peter's shadow might fall on some of them....
- 16 Crowds gathered also from the towns around Jerusalem,
- 17 bringing their sick & those tormented by impure spirits, and

ALL of them were HEALED



ALL were healed ... ALL of them ... and Apostles' Resolution was Rock Solid






Saint Peter healing the Sick with Shadow, c. 1635 by Laurent de la Hyre

- 17-18 High Priest ... filled with jealousy ... arrest apostles ... jail.
- 19 But during the night an angel of the Lord opened the jail doors....
- 20 "Go, stand in the temple courts," he said, "tell the people

Again, the MAIN message at the establishment of the church





- 5:17-24 Apostles Arrested & Angel Frees "Go Proclaim New Life"
- 21 At daybreak they entered the temple courts, as they had been told, and began to teach the people....
- 21-24 High Priest & full assembly find that

jail securely LOCKED, with the guards standing at the doors; but when we opened them, we found no one inside."

24 On hearing, the captain ... & priests were at a loss, wondering what this might lead to.

I suspect they WONDERED what the TRUTH might lead to

For us, though, the LOCKED jail and HOW the Angel led the apostles OUT is another rather hidden miracle

What comes to mind was HOW Jesus appeared in the Upper Room as though WALLS are subject to Angels' hands



5:25-28 Returning to the Scene - Freed & Back to Temple

- 25 Then someone came and said, "Look!
 Men you put in jail are standing in the temple courts teaching the people."
- 26 At that, the captain went with his officers ... did not use force, because they feared that the people would stone them.
- 27 The apostles ... before the Sanhedrin....


These leaders who rule Jerusalem - control what people SAY

5:25-28 Returning to the Scene - Freed & Back to Temple

28 "We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name," he said.

THEN they said some of the most astoundingly IGNORANT words

"Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and are

determined to make us guilty of this man's blood."

"Filled Jerusalem" you said?

"Determined to make us... us GUILTY" you say?

Religious Liberty was NOT a reality then

XVII. Religious Liberty. God alone is Lord of the conscience, and He has left it free from the doctrines and commandments of men which are contrary to His Word or not contained in it. Church and state should be separate. The state owes to every church protection and full freedom in the pursuit of its spiritual ends. In providing for such freedom no ecclesiastical group or denomination should be favored by the state more than others. Civil government being ordained of God, it is the duty of Christians to render loyal obedience thereto in all things not contrary to the revealed will of God. The church should not resort to the civil power to carry on its work. The gospel of Christ contemplates spiritual means alone for the pursuit of its ends. The state has no right to impose penalties for religious opinions of any kind. The state has no right to impose taxes for the support of any form of religion. A free church in a free state is the Christian ideal, and this implies the right of free and unhindered access to God on the part of all men, and the right to form and propagate opinions in the sphere of religion without interference by the civil power.







- ✓ One of three most significant Apostolic Church Fathers whose writings survive
- ✓ Clement of Rome & Ignatius of Antioch
- ✓ Roman Proconsul demanded sacrifice
- ✓ Polycarp did not sacrifice to consul's gods
- ✓ Few of his family tortured for his location

At 86 taken to arena, "Be Strong, Polycarp, play the man"


Proconsul, "Have respect for your old age, swear by the fortune of Caesar. Repent, and say, 'Down with the Atheists!'

"Eighty and six years I have served Him and He has done me no wrong. How then can I blaspheme my King & Savior?"






Proconsul, "I have wild animals here.

Proconsul, "If you despise the animals, I will have you burned."






Polycarp, "You threaten me with a fire that burns for an season, and after a little while is quenched;

Began to nail him, when Polycarp said,



Religious Liberty Freedom of Conscience Freedom of Speech





Religious Liberty a U.S. Right – NOT a Biblical Absolute

Baptists were primary in passing 1st Amendment
No religion has supported Religious Liberty more
Baptists wish NO coercion – sincerity cut in coercion
But Religious Liberty is ONLY deduced from the nature of a biblical view of Humankind and Free Will

Humankind

Free Will



Amendment I – Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for a redress of grievances.

Religious Liberty a U.S. Right – NOT a Biblical Absolute

NEED & concept evaporates without persecution

Freedom of Conscience is Precious but NOT Absolute

Why?

That is, when you are happy, esp. in the majority, you HAVE all liberty and don't need liberty by law Further, ALL are FREE, but Islam, et al, WRONG

belief in anything but Christ

will send you to HELL ...

Freedom of Religion is Best for AUTHENCITY



Religious Liberty of Peter and John

- ✓ Because of oppression of Jews & Minority Christians
- ✓ Because no one was truly FREE then in N.T. times
- ✓ We look back and find treatment by Jews bad
- ✓ What is NEW in 1776 U.S.A. and French Revolution?
- ✓ Freedom of Conscience was NEW in 1776
- ✓ All religions are equal in Religious Liberty
- ✓ Christianity is—we believe—THE TRUTH

5:29-32 Standing Their Ground – We Must Obey God

This time BOLD does NOT fit ...

seems short of fortitude ... short of Apostles' Resolution

29-30 - Peter and the other apostles replied:

"We must obey God rather than human beings!

The God of our ancestors raised Jesus from the dead—whom you killed by hanging him on a cross.

NOTE: Deut. 21:23 - "a hanged man is accursed by God."



5:29-32 Standing Their Ground – We Must Obey God
"We must obey God rather than human beings!"
Profound declaration to those who WANT to KILL them

- ✓ WHILE displacing/realigning human authority
- ✓ Apostles' Proclamation directs their duty to God



5:29-32 Standing Their Ground – We Must Obey God

31-32 - God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might bring Israel to repentance and forgive their sins. We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him."

Peter never wavers ... and theologizes

God exalted Christ to His right hand as

Prince & Savior





- 5:33-39 Waiting During Deliberations Revered Gamaliel Questions
- 33 When they heard this, they were furious and wanted to put them to death. Death! ... for what? for TRUTH!
- 34 But a Pharisee named Gamaliel, a teacher of the law, who was honored by all the people, stood up in the Sanhedrin and ordered that the men be put outside for a little while.
- 35 Then he addressed the Sanhedrin: "Men of Israel, consider carefully what you intend to do to these men.


Gamaliel - Honored by All

- ✓ I suppose he stood, "Men of Israel, consider carefully"
- ✓ Grandson of Hillel the Babylonian, 1st Century B.C.
- ✓ Greatest sage of 2nd Temple period, a Nasi or kind of prince
- ✓ Gamaliel was the teacher of the Apostle Paul
- ✓ Influential President of the Sanhedrin
- ✓ Several rulings benefiting women, including allowing to remarry w/ one witness on death of husband




5:33-39 Waiting During Deliberations – Revered Gamaliel Questions

- 36 Some time ago Theudas appeared, claiming to be somebody, and about four hundred men rallied to him.
 - He was killed, all his followers were dispersed, and it all came to nothing.
- ✓ Theudas, d. 46 A.D., Greek could be "Gift of God"
- ✓ Theudas could be Semitic for "flowing with water"
- ✓ Josephus said he claimed to be prophet & led folks to Jordan River
- Roman procurator chased him down, took his head




5:36-37 Waiting During Deliberations – Gamaliel, pt. 2

37 After him, Judas the Galilean (born in Gamala) appeared in the days of the census and led a band of people in revolt. He too was killed, and all his followers were scattered.

- ✓ Josephus said he founded a fourth Jewish sect after Pharisees, Sadducees, Essenes
- ✓ Nationalist movement of Zealots against Roman tax census
- ✓ Only God was ruler of Israel
- ✓ Gamala called such cause it was like Camel's hump





- 5:33-39 Waiting During Deliberations Revered Gamaliel Questions
- 38 Therefore, in the present case I advise you:
 - Leave these men alone! Let them go!

 For if their purpose or activity is of human origin, it will fail.
- 39 But if it is from God, you will not be able to stop these men; you will only find yourselves fighting against God."
- Gamaliel revered, respected, reasonable ...
 resoundingly resonated and
 then regaled rewardingly
 Recommending Rightly their Release

5:40-42 Rejoicing for the Honor – Flogged & Daily Preached

40 Gamaliel's speech persuaded them.

They called the apostles in and had them flogged.

Then they ordered them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go.



You CAN imagine what a flogging is like
That's being whipped bloody



5:40-42 Rejoicing for the Honor – Flogged & Daily Preached

41 The apostles left the Sanhedrin,
rejoicing because they had been counted
worthy of suffering disgrace for the Name.


