Hang on every word ... What Word?

SALVATION to the Gentile

Christ's Resurrection

Fulfilled All Mosaic Law

Yet the Jews are troubled apparently FOLLOW Paul 75 miles to Iconium

At Iconium Paul and Barnabas went as usual into the Jewish synagogue. There they spoke so effectively that a great number of Jews and Greeks believed.

² But the Jews who refused to believe STIRRED up the other Gentiles and poisoned their MINDS AGAINST THE BROTHERS.


8 In Lystra there sat a man who was lame.

Something most intriguing takes place


⁹ He listened to Paul as he was speaking. Paul looked directly at him, SAW THAT HE HAD FAITH to be healed



Yet, so many others were ... astounded

11 When the crowd saw what Paul had done, they shouted in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have come down to us in

human form!"

Lycaonia – north of the Taurus Mountains
... a large elevated plain ... and trade route
From the Acts, they retained their unique culture
Lycaonians were a warlike, wild race
Iconium was the capital since 300 B.C.

Much like Antioch in Pisidia
was a capital of sorts of Pisidia

When the crowd saw what Paul had done, they SHOUTED in the Lycaonian language, "The gods have come down to us in

HUMAN FORM!"

Paul they called Zeus, and Paul they called Hermes because he was the chief speaker.

There is no greater adoration ... THEY think Paul's clarity & the miracles attest

Paul & Barnabas in Lystra

Town in Anatolia ... Turkey today ...

- Lystra made Roman colony by Augustus (63 B.C. to A.D. 14), first & greatest Roman Emperor
- Mound was confirmed in 1820
- Border of Phrygia & Lycaonia passed between Iconium & Lystra
- Populated aristocracy of Roman soldiers from a garrison
- SUPERSTITIOUS ... gods came in likenesses of men
- * Barnabas "Zeus" & Paul "Hermes"



Lystra

Two inscriptions found in Lystra area

- 1. "Kakkan & Maramoas & Iman Licinius priests of Zeus"
- 2. "Toues Macrinus also called
 Abascantus and Batasis son of Bretasis having
 made in accordance with a vow at their own expense
 (a statue of) Hermes Most Great along with a sun-dial
 dedicated it to Zeus the sun-god."

Greek language is being overtaken by Latin with Romans


- Zeus god of sky = Roman Jupiter

 and the Muses



Paul was Hermes, "Chief Speaker" Hermes—Messenger of the gods

- god of trade
- god of thieves, travelers
- god of sports, athletes
- * god of border crossings
- Guide to the Underworld
- * Roman god Mercury
- Same as Hermes
- * Origin of "Merchandise"

Lystra

2 Timothy 3:8-9, after excoriating, exfoliating 8 verses,

Paul concludes verse 8, "They are men of depraved minds,

who, as far as the faith is concerned, are rejected."

Yet to dear Timothy ... 3:10-11 ... Paul implores:

- You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance,
- ¹¹ persecutions, sufferings—what kinds of things happened to me in Antioch, Iconium and Lystra, the persecutions I endured.

Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them.

When Paul and Silas return to Lystra on 2nd Journey

Timothy has become a LEADING Christian in Lystra

Paul recalls, we have to say, dear reflections in 2 Tim. 3:5,

I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also.

He [the Priest himself] and the crowd wanted to offer sacrifices to them.

What in the world? Might be tempted to say these Lycaonians were like Hillbillies

¹⁴ But when the apostles Barnabas & Paul heard of this, they tore their clothes and rushed out into the crowd, shouting:

and the sea and everything in them.

18 Even with these words, Barnabas & Paul had difficulty keeping the crowd from sacrificing to them.

Outrageous IGNORANCE ...

These Lycaonians LOVED their sacrificing
Rather, they BELIEVED their sacrificing
was their ONLY response to miracles



What made Paul such a great Leader?

First time, it was fairly clear:

- * Expertise in Exposition
- * Reasoning Superior to Jews
- Miracles & Signs from Lord

So effective, Lycaonians crowned Paul a god

Yet, the Lycaonians were easily distracted

Fortunately for them, Paul didn't distract
